### Damage to the MacBook

As per the Digital Learning Policy, where a loss, theft or damage [of the MacBook] is the result of negligence, carelessness, inattention or apparent disregard for the laptop or malice, parents/caregivers will be charged for the repair or replacement cost of a new MacBook. This includes (but is not limited to) screen damage, physical damage (for example, from being dropped) and water damage. These conditions apply whether the device is damaged on school grounds or off-site.

For this reason, Brighton Secondary School strongly recommends families add the supplied MacBook as an item on their own Home and Contents Insurance.

I understand regulation 52 of the Education Regulations 1997 (set out below) may be applied where there is damage to the provided MacBook.

# Regulations 52.

Where a student enrolled at a school damages school equipment or property the head teacher may require that student to meet the cost of repairing that damage and if, on request, the cost is not met by that student, it may be recovered by the Minister by action in a court of competent jurisdiction.

## Commitment to Pay Agreement - Mid-Program Enrolment

The MacBook remains the property of the Department of Education until such time as your child completes year 12, all Materials and Services Fees are paid in full and the full cost of the MacBook is paid for.

If your child leaves the school before year completing 12, or enrolled after year 10, the MacBook will remain the property of the Department of Education and must be returned to Brighton Secondary School. If you would like to take ownership of the MacBook, a buy-out option is available:

Student completed Year 11 Only: Materials & Services Fees must be paid in full plus an additional \$934.00

Student completed year 11 and 12: Materials & Services Fees must be paid in full plus an additional \$467.00

Student completed Year 12 Only: Materials & Services Fees must be paid in full plus an additional \$934.00
