

What's New for Year 10 in 2022?



Year 10 Students should have:



7 subjects per semester, plus a Home Group Line

Full Year Core Classes: English, Maths, Science

Semester Compulsory Classes: P.E., History

All Year 10s complete Personal Learning Plan (1 Semester)

• Some students will do this through other programs, such as SIM or Peer Leadership



Attempted to give students their highest priorities from subject selections

Personal Learning Plan

The PLP is the first SACE subject for most students

• A <u>compulsory</u> subject for all year 10 students, in order to attain SACE

The PLP encourages students to explore their identity, exploring how their past and present will have an influence on their future. Students investigate all aspects of their future, including work, life and study.

3 assignments – students <u>must</u> achieve a C grade (minimum) for all three assignments



All year 10s will be given subject recommendations for Stage I in the following subjects after the first semester:


- English



Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum

Emails and Daymap

- Students must check both daily
- Daymap will have, for all subjects, lesson outlines and resources
- Assessments and grades will be on Daymap, accessible through the Parent Portal

Mobile Phone/Personal Device Policy



Students must leave mobile/personal devices in lockers



Students can use mobile/personal devices during recess and lunch, before and after school



Mobile/personal devices are not permitted during classes, between lessons, on excursions or other school activities



If a student has a mobile/personal device on them during these times, the teacher may confiscate it for the lesson or a leader may confiscate it for the day

Other consequences may apply, following our Behaviour for Learning Policy

COVID Safety



All students are required to wear a mask whilst indoors or in groups (e.g. canteen line)



If a student test positive, contact the school and let them know the student is COVID positive

You will be given information about the COVID-safe processes



Encourage students to keep in contact with classes via Daymap (lesson plans and resources) and email (teachers)

Other Expectations

Year 10 students should be bringing their device to each class, along with required resources (writing book, pens/pencils, calculator, etc.)

Students must attend all scheduled classes; contact from home is needed to explain absences

Students should contact subject teachers with any concerns/questions and keep an eye out for responses

Parent Responsibilities

Contact school if student is expected to be absent for any part of the day (via phone or email to Student Services)

Contact Home Group teacher if a *uniform exemption* is needing to be requested*

 Please state the portion of the uniform, the reason and the expected date of return to full uniform

Stay up-to-date on Daymap with student grades, assignments and communications
