Following our breakfast provided from our accommodation at the Japanese Ryokan 'Sparkling Dolphins Inn', our scheduled coach arrived outside our doorstep at 8:15am. The full-day bus tour consisted of visiting an array of Japanese heritage sites such as temples Kinkaku-ji (金閣寺), Ryoan-ji (龍安寺), and Kiyomizu-dera (清水寺), with an extra visit to the stunning Bamboo forests of Arashiyama (嵐山).
